## A BILL FOR AN ACT

6(7)

To amend Title 5, at subsection (6) of Sections 5.201, subsection and 5.202, subsection (3) at Section 5.203, and Section 5.204 of the Kosrae State Code; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE KOSRAE STATE LEGISLATURE:

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to create a principal department to be called 1 the Department of Justice, replacing the Office of Attorney General; to further change the names 2 of the Division of Administration to become the Division of Law and further change the name of 3 the Division of Public Safety to become the Division of Public Safety and Enforcement. The 4 proposed changes will clarify the key functions of the divisions and allow administrative 5 functions under the department to be carried out by the Director and his/her staff and ensure that 6 essential functions of the state attorneys under the department are focused on the execution of the 7 duties under the department related to litigation, law enforcement and the law. The Division of 8 Law and the Division of Litigation will be headed by attorneys and the Division of Public Safety 9 10 and Law Enforcement will be headed by the Chief of Police who shall be hired by the Director of Justice based on credentials and the government recruitment policies; and for other purposes. 11 Section 2. Amendment. Title 5, Section 5.201(6) is hereby amended as follows: 12 "Section 5.201. The Executive has the following principal departments which 13 have the components indicated below: 14 (6) The Office of the Attorney General Department of Justice 15 (a) The Division of Public Safety-Law 16 (b) The Division of LawLitigation 17 (c) Division of Public Safety and Law Enforcement." 18

| 17 | "Section 5.204. Chief of Police. The Governor nominates, and following the consent of the     |
| 18 | Legislature by resolution, appoints a Chief of PoliceDirector hires following the established |
| 19 | government recruitment, a Chief of Police."   |
| 20 | Section 3. All other provisions in this Code, laws, regulations and policies referencing      |
| 21 | the Office Attorney General shall be amended to the Department of Justice, and the Attorney   |
| 22 | General to the Director.  |

2 upon its becoming law without such approval.
